Photography is a challenging and fascinating project. Anyone can "snap" a picture, but it takes a knowledgeable photographer to create a great image. 4-H photography members study and practice the art of making photographs. The project supplements other 4-H projects and activities. Photography may become a lifelong skill and hobby or a fulltime career.

The Photography Judging contests held at both Project Achievement Days and Club Congress give youth a chance to show off their skills and test their knowledge and understanding of photography concepts. There are other contests and learning opportunities for 4-H'ers to hone their skills as well.

Some of the things you will explore are the parts of a camera and their functions, how to choose a focal point to eliminate clutter in your photographs, how to use different viewpoints to create interest in your photos, and how creative composition can improve your photos. Enhance your skills as a photographer by learning how lighting affects the mood of a photograph. Explore abstract photography with ordinary subject matter. Learn how to create useful photographs designed to teach, instruct, or sell an item or service. Explore how to use color to create photos that grab attention.

Exploring Depth Advanced

Deepen your mastery of photography by learning how to capture a high-quality, creative photograph in a low light situation. Create abstract photos demonstrating an understanding of symmetry/asymmetry, patterns and textures, shapes and forms, and rhythms. Create highquality photos that demonstrate the appropriate use of advanced equipment through practice.


4-H Record Book

4-H youth can submit a record book in the Photography category.


Record books are a fun way to build a portfolio and showcase your growth as a photographer.
