- Promote the highest standards of safety, sportsmanship, and ethical behavior.
- Teach safe and responsible use of firearms & archery as well as sound decision making, self-discipline and concentration.
- Learn new skills from certified volunteer leaders in the discipline they instruct.

Starting Out Beginner

Shooting Sports:

- Learning Safety and Range Commands on the Range.
- Keep a shooting diary with notes and observations.
- Identify different types of safety gear and equipment and learn how to use them.
- Demonstrate how to safely handle a firearm.
- Participate in live fire exercises with fundamentals of firearm safety.

Learning More Intermediate

- Give a presentation on some technical aspect of 4-H Shooting Sports.
- Set specific goals related to 4-H Shooting Sports disciplines and develop a plan to accomplish these goals.
- Learn new skills while kayaking or while fishing at a club sponsored event.

Exploring Depth Advanced

- Develop your own special 4-H Shooting Sports Discipline event. Create a plan, chart progress, analyze successes and or problems and report the results.
- Arrange a field trip for your project members to a location that has significance to firearms and archery equipment.
- Demonstrate proficiency in correct shooting.
