


### **4-H Dairy Cattle Project**



When youth have a passion for animals, the 4-H Dairy Cattle Project provides a great opportunity to explore their interest. From dairy poster contests, judging contests, and visual presentations to showing dairy cattle, 4-H'ers can participate in aspects of the project with or without owning dairy cattle.

The project teaches animal husbandry including selecting, feeding, and managing of dairy cattle. Developing teamwork, responsibility, and decision-making alongside both animals and people is unique to the livestock program experience. Hobbies or careers in animal agriculture enable utilization of these lifelong skills and project mastery.

# **Starting Out**Beginner

Join a 4-H club to meet experienced volunteers and make new friends. There is so much to learn in starting a dairy animal project. Seek opportunities in your club to volunteer for various tasks at your county show. Develop visual presentations to learn about dairy cattle topics of interest, and then share them with your club and in contests. You can promote milk with the June Dairy Month Poster Contest.

knowledge Put vour into practice by competing in contests and purchasing a dairy animal to show. Join a judging team in dairy cattle or dairy products judging. Be part of a Dairy Bowl team. Show your animal at the county, district, and state shows. Explore topics complex visual presentations such as genetics or nutrition. Document project activities and goals in your record book.

## **Exploring Depth**Advanced

Advance your animal selection and skills in exhibiting your dairy animals by competing in regional and national shows. Share your project experience with junior 4-H'ers. Use your project record book to assess costs. milk records, and other project milestones that advanced your animal project to the highest level. Be sure showcase your skills in Cattle the Dairy Premier Exhibitor competition.


### 4-H Record Book


National 4-H currently offers three guides in their Dairy Cattle Series.
