


Forestry

Measuring trees to estimate timber volumes is another useful skill that will be mastered.

Activity Suggestions

Use any of the project publications for activities.

Use "Forests of Fun" publications available at your County Extension Office.

Competitive Activities (Indicate Jr or Sr or Both): County forestry teams preferably will consist of four 4-H members. The top three individual scores will be recorded per team. Individual 4-H members can also compete.

JUDGING:

Junior Age Level (8-13) Forestry Judging

The contest consists of three sections:

- A. Tree Identification (20 specimens indoor only).
- B. Tree Measurement (3 trees: DBH and merchantable height using a tree scale stick).
- C. Forest Knowledge (20 question test).

Senior Age Level (14-18) Forestry Judging

The first-place senior team will advance to the National 4-H Invitational at Jackson's Mill 4-H Conference Center in Weston, WV. https://4hforestryinvitational.org/

The contest consists of four sections:

- A. Tree Identification (25 indoor specimens and 25 indoor specimens).
- B. Tree Measurement (10 trees: DBH and merchantable height using a tree scale stick).
- C. Forest Knowledge (50 question test).
- D. Forest Insect and diseases (common names of 10 insects and 10 diseases).

VISUAL PRESENTATION:(Junior and Senior) Conservation [includes Wildlife and Forestry]

OUR/FIELD TRIP IDEAS: Arbor Day events, youth forestry field days, arboretum tours, timber processing mill tours.

IDEAS FOR AWARDS AND RECOGNITION: Certificates, Medals, Trophies, Plagues, Cash.

TRIPS: The winning 4-H senior forestry team wins one year custody of the Acorn Trophy and the right to represent Mississippi sponsored trip at the National 4-H Forestry Invitational in Weston, WV – The Super Bowl of 4-H Forestry!
